

The Cosmo Oil Eco Card Fund endeavors to realize a sustainable society by conducting activities around two themes: "restoration and preservation of the environment in Japan and overseas" and "education of the next generation."

Given that poverty, food shortages, education and other social issues are closely related to environmental problems, our Living With Our Planet Projects take measures in line with its two main focuses:"initiatives in response to global warming" and "preservation of biodiversity," in the belief that they will lead to substantive solutions. Eco Card holders' annual donations (¥500/cardholder) and contributions from the Cosmo Oil Group are used to provide each project with a subsidy determined by their activities. In fiscal 2013 we extended our support to 14 projects. Three of these achieved their goals and we have discontinued the Fund's support. However, we also added three new projects in fiscal 2014 and continute to support activities for 14 projects.
